The City Council of the City of Thibodaux assembled in regular session via Zoom Video Conference on Tuesday, June 16, 2020 at 5:00 P.M.

The minutes of the June 2, 2020 City Council Meeting were approved as written.

The Finance Director presented the Monthly Financial Report as required by the State's Agreed-Upon Procedures for May 2020.

In accordance with Article VI, Section 1(A) of the Thibodaux City Charter, the Council "shall call a special meeting of the Council during the week following the first regular Council meeting in July of each year for the sole purpose of having a pre-budget conference between the Mayor and members of the Council".

On motion of Councilwoman Johnson, seconded by Councilman Tabor, the Council voted unanimously to adopt a motion setting the date for the pre-budget conference to Wednesday, July 15, 2020 at 5:00 PM.

The City utilizes the wetlands enhancement process as an additional means of treatment for City sewerage.

Since this process was approved, the City is required to monitor the effectiveness of the program in accordance with the provisions of our LPDES Discharge Permit.

The City has received a proposal from the Nicholls State University Department of Biological Sciences to provide the required monitoring service for the year June 1, 2020 thru July 31, 2021 at a cost of \$28,541.00.
