Nathan Oubre Public Works Fire Inspector

Being a resident of Thibodaux for over 23 years, Nathan has been married to his wife, Cindy, for 38 years and they have 3 children and 2 grandchildren. Nathan has worked for the City of Thibodaux for 9 years. When he is not at work, Nathan enjoys being with his grandchildren.

On a typical day, Nathan is tasked with testing fire hydrants and doing fire pre-plans for businesses throughout the City. There are 855 fire hydrants and 750 businesses in the City of Thibodaux that Nathan has to test and visit at least once a year. Currently, Nathan is working on having some fire hydrants replaced due to their age.

When asked to comment what is most rewarding about his job while working for the City of Thibodaux and what makes it worthwhile, Nathan said, "Meeting with all of the business owners in Thibodaux to ensure they are prepared and up to date with their pre-plans for the fire department in case of fire or inspection."

Nathan's proudest moment working for the City of Thibodaux was becoming the Fire Inspector for the City.

Nathan noted his biggest achievement to date is being the assistant Fair Chairman for the Thibodaux Volunteer Fire Department for the last 20 years. Nathan has been a member of the Thibodaux Volunteer Fire Department for 21 years.

In 2013 the City of Thibodaux's Recreation Department wanted to afford the opportunity for young swimmers in our community to be able to compete at a reasonable price. We devised a plan to create our own Swim Team and have our municipal pool as its home. There was a significant investment in time and talent for this to even be remotely possible. Our plan was thorough, detailed, and it was ground roots. We were starting from scratch. We had one part-time coach (Andrea Lotz), one full-time director (Kevin Clement), no swimmers, no lane ropes, no starting blocks ... we didn't even have a stopwatch or a team name. But slowly we started, swimmer by swimmer, parent by parent, race by race we competed. We struggled mightily, but we competed.

And each year we showed progress, our number of swimmers increased, our times improved. We came up with a team name, a logo, added volunteer coaches and parent groups.

In 2013 we had maybe 72 swimmers; now in 2021, we have over 250 participants. For seven years we put our noses to the grindstone and went to work. Sometimes as early as 6:30 am, sometimes as late as 8:00 pm, whenever there was free pool time, you could find a coach and a TigerShark splashing around in the pool. We laid a solid foundation and continued to build, brick by brick. There have been many swimmers and parents who have been a part of this since 2014, and they all have been instrumental in our success.

This past Saturday at the Championship meet in Cut Off, the Thibodaux TigerSharks were crowned Champions. While we are excited about this victory, we are even more proud and impressed with the culture we have created and the friendship we have fostered. For 7 years we have continued to create a bond between the City of Thibodaux Recreation Department and the participants of this group. Many feel like they were part of a special summer experience and as a result will never forget the lessons learned or the relationships developed. You will always accomplish more in victory as a team than you would as individuals.


